# The Twelve Days after Christmas CLOSING REMARKS

**Music Director Nigel Groome** trained at the London College of Music, and carried out postgraduate study at the Royal College of Music.

From 1980 to 2016 he was Organist and Director of Music of Beckenham Parish Church. Last year Nigel took up a new post at St. Matthew's, Westminster, and as a result has decided to relinquish his duties with WCS. So this is his last concert!

**Organist John Radford** was born in Wakefield, where he was a chorister at the cathedral. He received a bursary to study music at Ackworth School, and then studied music at Leeds University.

He is currently the organist for a group of village churches in East Dorset, and is the accompanist for The Broadstone Choir and The Allen Singers.

Originally from Bedfordshire, **Grace Lovelass (mezzo soprano)** attended the Crescent Academy for Performing Arts and went on to read Classics at King's College London, taking lead roles in the annual King's College Greek Play performed in ancient Greek. She made her classical/operatic debut at the Bournemouth Music Competitions Festival in 2015, and in 2016 she won first place in five classes.

Alongside a busy schedule of concert performances, she appeared with the Dorset Opera chorus in both the 2016 and 2017 seasons, covering the role of Siébel in Gounod's Faust this summer. She recently completed a diploma in opera at the Associated Studios in London.

**Reuben Bennett (trumpet)** is 14 and goes to Poole Grammar School. He is a member of the school's Big Band and Concert Band and recently enjoyed playing the trumpet in the school's production of the musical 'Our House'. Reuben is a member of Swanage Town Band and sings in St Mary's Swanage Church Choir. He is working towards grade 8 on the trumpet and piano.

**Arthur Brooke (treble)** is 12 and is also at Poole Grammar. He now sings with Poole Grammar School Voices. He plays the piano and the bass guitar but rarely does as much practice as his mother would like!
