Hazel Ricketts studied music at the University of Surrey, with piano as her first instrument, and gained her MA in Musicology from the University of Southampton. She has sung in choirs since the age of 6, started accompanying them at the age of 14, and has now been conducting them for nearly 20 years. She also plays the clarinet, and in recent years has rediscovered the organ – studying with John Challenger (Salisbury Cathedral). She was Director of Music at Holy Trinity Church in Fareham for 15 years before moving to the Salisbury Area. She has taught the piano, singing, clarinet and music theory both in private schools and more recently Hampshire Music service, where she was also the conductor of "Castle Singers", Hampshire County Council's "workplace choir".

Her current work includes teaching piano and clarinet in both primary and secondary schools in Wiltishire and she is active as a church music leader and organist in the Salisbury area playing at many different churches. She is also an active member of the local "Wessex" RSCM committee, and has often sung as an 'extra' for visiting choirs to Salisbury Cathedral. In 2018 was appointed Musical Director of Wareham Choral Society.

John Radford was born in Wakefield, where he was a chorister at the cathedral. He received a bursary to study music at Ackworth School, and then studied music at Leeds University. He has had posts as organist and teacher at Portsmouth and in Somerset. He is currently the organist for a group of village churches in East Dorset, and is the accompanist to The Broadstone Choir and The Allen Singers (Wimborne).

Grace Lovelass is a mezzo soprano based on the south coast. As well as singing Adalgisa (Norma) with Heber Opera this spring, other roles include Olga in Eugene Onegin with the Oxford Alternative Orchestra and The People's Opera, Tisbe in La Cenerentola, the Sorceress/Spirit in Dido & Aeneas and Flora in La Traviata. Grace has appeared in the chorus at the Dorset Opera Festival for three consecutive years, singing small and cover roles, as well as in Die Zauberflöte with Hurn Court Opera earlier this year. She also performed under the direction of Pamela Howard OBE as part of Bernstein in Chichester 2018.

Originally from Bedfordshire, Grace read Classics at King's College London, taking lead roles in the annual King's College Greek Play performed in ancient Greek. After moving to Dorset, she joined Wareham's Rex Players – a group of variety performers who have raised over $\pounds 60,000$ for charity.

She is also a trained ballroom and Latin dancer and has competed at the world famous Blackpool Tower Ballroom.

Tenor Richard Rowntree studied voice, viola and piano at Trinity College of Music, London. He is greatly in demand as a consort singer and regularly appears with many of the country's leading groups including The Monteverdi Choir, The Gabrieli Consort, The Sixteen, The King's Consort, Tallis Scholars, Tenebrae, I Fagiolini, The Clerke's Group, The English Concert, Choir of the

Age of Enlightenment, Retrospect Ensemble, Britten Sinfonia Voices, The Cambridge Singers, The London Handel Festival, Ex Cathedra, Concert d'Astree, The Armonico Consort, Ensemble Oculum, and The Philharmonia Voices. Richard has recorded for English National Opera and The Early Opera Company.

As a soloist, Richard has appeared with The Gabrieli Consort in London, Paris, Rome and at the 2011 BBC Proms. Richard made his solo debut at The Wigmore Hall with Retrospect Ensemble in 2010 and made a return visit, again with Retrospect Ensemble, in 2011. Richard also made his solo debut with The English Concert at St John's, Smith Square, London in December 2011.

Recent engagements have included tours to Malta with The English Concert, Germany and the USA with The Monteverdi Choir, making his debut at Carnegie Hall, New York and in Australia with The Australian Chamber Orchestra, including his debut at Sydney Opera House. Richard also appears regularly with The Kings Consort and has toured recently to Spain, Germany, France Holland, Lichtenstein and Austria with them.

Katie Salomon (née Flanaghan) is a professional harpist based in South-West England. In 2008 she gained a Bachelor's degree in harp from the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, where she studied with Charlotte Seale. After graduating Katie went on to study with Sioned Williams, Principal Harp of the BBC Symphony Orchestra.

Katie has recorded with record labels including Deutsche Grammophon, Universal, Decca and Demon records, for artists including Aled Jones, Camilla Kerslake, Celeste and The Choir Girl. Other recordings with choir include performances of Bernstein Chichester Psalms, Britten Ceremony of Carols, Holst Rig Veda and Janacek Otce nas

Katie began her musical career as a chorister at Salisbury Cathedral, directed by Dr Richard Seal and Simon Lole. Her love of harp was inspired by her first harp teacher, Morfen Edwards.

Katie is now much in demand as a harpist, with a career that has seen her perform at venues as diverse as Buckingham Palace, the Royal Society of Medicine, London Guildhall, Wembley Pavilion Arena and the Royal Institute of British Architects with highlights being solo stage performances for the Wimbledon Champions' Award Ceremony and the Rugby World Cup, and premiering Gary Carpenter's Azaleas which went on to win a British Composer Award.
